Initial Payment for Sea Base - April 8-14, 2018

Troop 15 / Crew 215 -

As you know, we put in for a Sea Base expedition and were lucky enough to land reservations for three Coral Reef Sailing Crews or 24 people, including 6 adults. The expedition will commence on April 8 and end on April 14. We need to work out the logistics but we will most likely travel to Sea Base on April 7.

Cost per person, excluding transportation and other incidentals, is \$884 and we will collect four payments of \$221.

The following is the information received from Sea Base to help you determine if you are eligible to participate as well as other planning tips.

 Congratulations on your 2018 Lottery or Open Reservation selection. We are excited to have the opportunity to serve your unit!

This email is our first correspondence to help you prepare for your upcoming adventure. In the future you will receive additional emails, text messages and a mailer. Please read these correspondences and begin to put together an action plan that will prepare your unit for a successful adventure. Further, throughout 2017 and 2018 we will be posting information via social media. Please tell your crew and parents to like us on [Facebook](#).

Here are a few things that you should know immediately:

General

- Every participant must be a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America. This includes parents of Scouts.
- Every Sea Base participant must complete a [BSA Annual Health and Medical Record](#). No other medical form will be accepted. [BSA AHMR](#) are good for one year through the end of the month in which it was completed. For example; If a [BSA AHMR](#) was completed on June 2, 2017 it is valid through the end of June 2018.

- Every Sea Base participant, youth and adult, must be in good physical health as evidenced on the [BSA AHMR](#).
- Participants must be at least 13 years old and currently in or graduated from the 8th grade or 14 by September 1, 2018. Individuals that are **going** into the 8th grade are not eligible unless they turn 14 by September 1, 2018.
- Every participant must complete the BSA Swim Test prior to arrival which must be documented on the [BSA Unit Swim Classification Record](#). The test can be administered at your local Scout Camp or by any certified lifeguard or swim instructor. Upon arrival each participant must complete a Sea Base Swim Review. This review does not take the place of the [BSA Swim Test](#). Any participant, youth or adult, who cannot complete the Swim Test prior to arrival or the Swim Review upon arrival will not be allowed to participate and will be sent home. No refund will be given for non-swimmers.

Leaders

- Every Adult Leader must meet all of the criteria listed above.
- Every Sea Base Adventure Crew must have at least two adult leaders. Troops and Teams must have one adult over 21 years of age and another over the age of 18. Venture Crews, Exploring Posts and Sea Ships must have two adult leaders over the age of 21. Any unit with both male and female crew members, youth or adult, must have both male and female adult leaders over the age of 21.
- Every Adult Leader must complete BSA or Venturing Youth Protection Training, BSA Safe Swim and Safety Afloat Training and BSA Weather Hazards. Your unit must provide copies of each training.
- At least one Adult Leader per crew must have both Wilderness First Aid and CPR training or hold a higher professional certification. A listing of approved Wilderness First Aid and CPR courses can be found at the [American Camping Association](#) website.

Crews

- Crews must have a youth to adult ratio of 50% or greater. Individuals 18- 20 may be counted as either youth or adult participants as they are eligible to register as youth participants in Exploring or Venturing or

adult leaders in Troops or Teams.

- Every crew must bring a standard backcountry first aid kit. In addition to items typically found in a standard backcountry first aid kit, participants should also bring the following:
 - SPF 40 or greater reef safe biodegradable sunscreen. According to researchers 4,000 to 6,000 metric tons of sunscreen washes into the ocean annually. Up to 10% of all coral reefs are threatened by sunscreen induced coral bleaching. Reef Safe Sunscreen is offered for sale online and onsite at the [Florida Sea Base Ship Store](#).
 - Vinegar, small plastic bottle.
 - Bonine Motion Sickness Medication
 - SPF 40 or greater lip balm.
 - Non- aerosol, non-spray insect repellent.
 - Swimmers ear drops.
 - Benadryl
